
What is the impact of Packback?

The following are our findings from our national research study.

1. Students using Packback were more likely to have earned an A in their course than students using LMS discussion, and less likely to have earned a D, F, or W. These outcomes are tied not only to greater student engagement, but to the greater faculty engagement driven by Packback.


At FSCJ in online courses, students using Packback showed a
54% increase in A's and a
47% decrease to earn D's, F's, or W's.

Data from Florida State College at Jacksonville Data statistically significant at the 1% level. 2. Instructors on Packback had increased satisfaction with the course discussion.




Our findings with FSCJ from Fall of 2019.

1. On Packback, 27.74% of student posts had at least one link. On Canvas, 9.5% of student posts had at least one link.



2. On Packback, 45.50% of posts had more than 130 words. On Canvas, 32.78% of posts had more than 130 words.
